SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Superintendent Raymer reported that the phone training will held on Monday, May 7, and the system will be installed on Tuesday after school, May 8. On Wednesday morning, May 9, the new phone system will go live.

The Safe Routes to School project will start this week. They will start pouring concrete by the high school and Wellness Center and move south. Dan Carson asked for permission to use the high school gym on Sunday evening, April 22, for a follow-up session to the Kingdom Youth Conference. Mr. Raymer will be out on April 17 for his sister's memorial service in Phoenix. Superintendent Raymer gave a school finance update.

Jared Sowers gave the NWKTC meeting report. The college will be conducting a conceal and carry class and a black smith class for students and community members. They are also going to start a new program centering around 3D printing. They are expanding their student recruiting to southeast Kansas.

DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

ACCEPT BID - Carried 7-0

It was moved and seconded to accept the bid from Weathercraft Goodland in the amount of \$66,284.95 to replace the high school gym roof.

Superintendent Raymer reviewed the board responses from the strategic planning survey. Priorities for the board include facilities, staffing, class offerings, athletics, and leadership. He will fine tune the document and create a formalized document for the board to approve.

Projected preschool enrollment for the next year was discussed. A grant to fund the program for the 2018-2019 year will be submitted to BCCII in June.

Cindy Wiley, certified driver's education instructor, will teach drivers education classes again this summer. Cindy is the driver's education instructor for St. Francis and Atwood. Cindy will be paid \$1000 by the district and also receive the state reimbursement. In addition, each Cheylin student will pay \$75 for the course and other students will pay \$100. Classes for Cheylin students will begin on June 11 and run through June 29. Students are eligible at age 14, and we anticipate 9 will participate. Classes will be held M-F from 8 to 12 noon and students will have driving/vehicle time at a minimum of 30 minutes per day.

A committee of teacher representatives and Superintendent Raymer will review the student handbook and bring any recommendations to the policy committee. The board will have final approval on any additions and/or revisions made to the handbook.

The proposed Junior High/High School 2018-2019 schedule was reviewed. A preliminary enrollment will be done with the students before the end of the school year.

APPROVE CHEER CONSTITUTION - Carried 7-0

It was moved and seconded approve the training rules for the Junior High and High School Cheer Squads for the 2018-2019 school year.

The capital outlay priorities were reviewed and the BOE was updated on the progress of the projects.

The building committee did a walk through the buildings prior to the meeting with Superintendent Raymer. The heater on the gym roof has been out for 2 years and will need to be replaced after the roof has been redone. The committe recommended we look into adding air conditioning to the gym. Additional projects include remodeling the bathrooms in the lower hall of the high school building and updating the lighting in both buildings to LED.
